


Dear Friends,

The holy season of Advent-Christmastide is right for reflection on the immense grace of God's interaction with our human family. Christmas (Feast of the Incarnation) is a celebration of God's revelation of divine love in Jesus. The prologue to the Gospel according to St. John speaks of the majestic power of God as the Word (Logos). That power (Word) was revealed in Jesus as flesh and blood; one who was fully engaged in human life and who showed us as much of God as can be comprehended by human experience and limitation.

Throughout the Christian liturgical calendar we revisit the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus and his ministry amongst God's people. Doing so we are challenged to discern God's continuing presence in daily life.

Although at Christmastide we are drawn to the remembrance of the birth of Jesus we also have opportunity to celebrate daily his continuing presence with us. Jesus' teaching about the Kingdom of God affirms that the Kingdom of God is amongst us (Luke 17:21). In Paul's letter to the Romans he writes that "the word is near you, on your lips and in your heart" (Romans 10:8).

The vision of St. John the Divine of a world redeemed and purified includes these words: "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth and I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples and God himself will be with them – see, I am making all things new" (Revelation 21:1,3,5).





God, through the grace of the Holy Spirit still comes into our lives – perhaps through the beautiful music, scripture, and poetry of this hallowed time; through the sacraments; through the arts; and through loving acts done for us and by us. We have the opportunity daily to welcome our blessed Lord. May we joyfully do so.


BR. SIMON has returned as a novice at West Park. We are delighted to have him back with us.

They sought to soar into the skies, Those classic gods of high renown, For lofty pride aspires to rise, But you came down.


You dropped down from the mountains sheer, Forsook the eagle for the dove; The other Gods demanded fear, But you gave love.
